



Speaking of Cemeteries

As we prepare to map out our work for the coming year we wanted to remind you about our collaboration with the Town in maintaining a listing of the locations and burials throughout the town of Eliot. The town helps with the annual fee to maintain this site, and when used in conjunction with the GIS mapping program on the Assessors Page (https://www.eliotmaine.org/assessor/pages/assessors-database), it is a great resource in locating the many private family cemeteries and those in the Mt. Pleasant and Brooks Memorial Cemeteries. You can find the site through the town website or go to https://mosersoft.com/cemv8/lotsearch.aspx (149 – Mt. Pleasant, 151- Brooks, 152- Private cemeteries) In addition, if you'd like to see the stones in Mt. Pleasant Cemetery (updated to 2013) you can find PDF pages at www.thenegoodwinproject.com look under "PDF Books" and you will find them shown by sections in the cemetery, with the designation "Eliot Record Book". This was the result of our project to update Dr. John E. Frost's "Eliot Record Book", for the town's bicentennial, in 2010. An ongoing process, I took pictures of all the burial stones in both the public and private cemeteries throughout the town and updated the listings in Dr. Frost's work. The Goodwin Family Association, who has the rights to Dr. Frost's publications, then took over the publishing of this information and pictures. They also have plans to do the same for the private family cemeteries and Brooks Memorial Cemetery. We will keep you posted and let you know when those pictures are available. If you are interested in helping with cleaning private cemeteries this coming year please let me know! - Rosanne
