#### **SPEAKING OF CEMETERIES**

Recognizing that the purpose of our "Adopt a Cemetery" program has always been to encourage and facilitate the pairing of people with the care of the old private family cemeteries, we will not be planning any cleaning dates this year. We will continue to disseminate information, advise, and offer hands-on help where we can so that people have the tools to properly care for cemeteries. To that end, our EHS posters and publicity feature that message.

We received two inquiries of concern for a private cemetery in eastern Eliot needing attention. Reaching out to members and residents who had expressed interest in helping (on an Eliot Facebook page) we connected them and have left it to the initial inquirer to organize a clean-up, this spring.

Especially heartening was hearing (on social media and from family member Noreen Morang) the work that the Holmes family has been doing to provide continuing care for the Knight and Remick cemeteries on the family's property.
