

President's Prattle

There are so many fascinating facts and interesting stories about our town's history and those who are a part of it. At the top of the list is Sarah Jane Farmer. In her time here in Eliot, Sarah created a unique

setting that attracted visitors from around the world. After attending the Parliament of the World's Religions in Chicago with her father, she established the Greenacre Conferences in 1894 which encouraged discussion of various philosophical ideas of religion and the peace movement. Attendees included the local women's clubs, the women's suffrage movement, and the attendees from the Ralph Waldo Emerson groups.

Within a short period of time, Greenacre attracted wide attention because of its intellectual and spiritual exchange and brought together several well-known writers, artists and intellectuals. This list includes Booker T. Washington, Julia Ward Howe, W.E.B Du Bois and Sara Bull, the wife of the famous Norwegian violinist, Ole Bull. Sara Bull was also a staunch supporter of Swami Vivekananda, who was a key figure responsible for introducing the philosophy of Vedanta and Yoga to the Western world. It has been shared with me, that in fact, the first yoga class may have taken place for the first time in the western world, right here in Eliot, Maine. This is just the beginning of the story of Sarah Jane Farmer. If
